ElderHelp supporting San Diego seniors through the COVID-19 Crisis

San Diego, CA — During the COVID-19 crisis, ElderHelp is committed to sustaining the health and well-being of San Diego County seniors, especially those who are isolated or home bound with limited access to food, medical services, and family support. During this incredibly challenging time, ElderHelp is working around the clock to provide seniors with the support they need to shelter in place.

Because we provide ESSENTIAL SERVICES that keep seniors safe and healthy, we continue our work in compliance with Governor Newsom's executive order.

- Friendly visits—We have tripled the number of daily check-in calls made each day. Seniors who are matched with volunteers continue to receive friendly visits via phone chats, allaying fears and anxiety and alerting staff of potential serious medical concerns.
- Grocery shopping—Healthy volunteers are delivering fresh groceries (at no charge) and supplies to doorsteps to maintain health and nutrition.
- Seniors A Go Go rides—Volunteers and staff provide medically necessary transportation to ensure ongoing health needs are met.
- Housing Services—We are providing telephone consultations and ongoing support for residents at local senior housing facilities through our partnership with the San Diego Food Bank.
